FROM THE CANTOR



It is December, and the days have grown shorter and the nights longer, bringing to mind the passage in the Talmud describing Adam's first encounter with this phenomenon. "Woe is me! Perhaps because I have sinned the world around me is being darkened, returning

to its state of chaos and confusion. This then is the end to which I have been sentenced from Heaven!" Adam, in short order, came to understand that this, rather, is the natural order of things. He came to expect that the days would again lengthen, just as he came to expect that each day the sun would rise again to dispel the darkness. We, too, expect the winter solstice to mark a renewed lengthening of the days, just as we take for granted that the rising sun will bring the light of day. What we no longer expect is the darkness of the night, having long since become accustomed to and dependant upon our man-made illumination to turn darkness into daylight.

And yet darkness it was that spread over us as Hurricane Sandy battered our shores and wreaked havoc upon so many, leaving us without power or light. By now, the power has been restored for most, but for far too many, life will never be the same. Homes have been destroyed, memories washed away by the surging tide, lives lost to the fury of nature. Yet while Sandy brought in the worst of what wind and water can do, it also brought out the best of what man can do, showing us once again how when we are tested we are capable of rising up and reaching out with an immense generosity of spirit.

It is December, and rather than curse the darkness we light a candle, first one, and then another. We seek not to dispel all the darkness, but to bring enough light to replace the gloom and despair with hope. We light candles as our everlasting expression of our determination to rebuild and to renew. We kindle the lights of the menorah, inspired by the courage and faith of our ancestors, and committed to overcoming our challenges. And we share the light, knowing that a candle loses not its strength as it lights even a thousand others.

May this Hanukkah bring strength and inspiration, peace and joy, renewal and hope, for us, for *Am Yisrael*, and for the entire world.

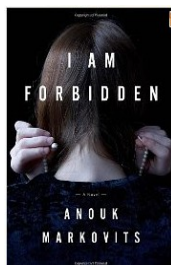
Let's keep the momentum going and Happy Hanukkah to all.

The planning began back in July when TBOBT and the Clark USY chapter accepted the Hagalil Region's invitation to host the Fall Kinnus the weekend of November 16-18th. The dates were reserved on the temple calendar, emails, mailings & phone calls were made asking for volunteers & an inventory of tables and chairs was taken. As the dates drew nearer more calls were made, favors were asked, deals were made and by Thursday night, November 15th, **ALL** 201 registrants were accepted and placed in a house (at least for the first night)! Transportation arrangements were made to move large numbers of USYers multiple times throughout the weekend to as near as Valley Road and as far as Highland Park. Large quantities of food, drink, regalia, prayer books, study materials, and snacks were delivered. We were ready!

They arrived on Friday starting at 2:00 PM and before you knew it the lobby was filled with happy teens hugging their friends along with luggage, pillows, sleeping bags and more. The energy level was high as the USYers checked in and were matched with their host homes. There wasn't much time before everyone had to be back in their Shabbat finest ready for candle lighting, orientation, ice breakers and kitot (study sessions). Back in the social hall tables were being set (23 in all) for the first of several meals to be served throughout the weekend. After a delicious meal with lots of ruach, the USYers welcomed Shabbat with a beautiful service. The evening concluded with a special oneg and then off to the host homes for perhaps some sleep.

Shabbat services on Saturday morning brought much nachos as we watched these young men and women daven, read Torah, chant haftorah, deliver devrei Torah. The future of Judaism is in excellent hands! Shabbat was spent eating, studying, discussing, learning, eating more, eating again, socializing, davening, and saying goodbye to Shabbat with a very moving Havdalah service. Then the frenzy erupted as the USYers prepared for the dance. Operation transportation was activated and before you knew it everyone was brought to our neighboring shul, TBEMC in Cranford, who was hosting the dance. A midnight pick up meant many a host was out and about long past their regular bed time but no one minded. The energy being emitted from the youth was contagious! After several runs up and down Walnut Avenue a large group was tucked in at TBOBT for the evening. The others returned once again to their host homes (maybe more will sleep this night than the previous one).

From the look of things on Sunday morning there appeared to be many very tired USYers as they trudged back in to TBOBT with their suitcases, pillow pets, and sleeping bags. But it wasn't long before they were once again energized. Conversations were flowing (especially about their concern for Israel), groups were forming to brainstorm about what they pray for (peace, family, college acceptance letters), and the young men and women were putting on tefillin in preparation for Shacharit. Breakfast was served (how many times did we set those tables?) before everyone returned to the sanctuary for a program on "Being the change" – one man's efforts to free children sold into slavery in Ghana and the schools he has built through his fundraising efforts. As the clock approached noon the USYers knew the time was near for the end of this convention. Once again they gathered in the social hall for a rousing round of lively ruach. The weekend ended just as it began with endless hugs. During these 48 hours together new friendships were forged and existing ones were strengthened. New memories were made while we reminisced over those from the past (it seemed like only yesterday that we were the USYers attending the events and how did our children get from being the attendees to now being the staff?).

Hagalil USY, while we opened our home to you for this kinnus, you gave so much more to us. Thank you for bringing your energy and love of Judaism to TBO/BT for this one very special Shabbat.

THE EDITH & MARK LIEF MEMORIAL LECTURE

SUNDAY, JANUARY 27, 2013 AT 9:45 AM

Agi Legutko, a Visiting Assistant Professor in Yiddish Language, Literature and Culture at the Meyerhoff Center for Jewish Studies at the University of Maryland, College Park, will lecture on

“Jewish Culture in Today’s Poland: An Appropriation or a New Beginning?”

The Holocaust put an end to a flourishing Jewish community in Poland, which until the Second World War, had been the largest Jewish center in Europe, cherishing a vibrant thousand-year-old history. What is happening with Jewish life in Poland today? The talk will offer a brief overview of Jewish history in post-war Poland and will address the revival of Jewish life in Poland happening right now. Professor Legutko will also discuss the intriguing phenomenon of the contemporary rise of interest in Jewish culture among Polish non-Jews, illustrated by the numerous Jewish culture festivals, as well as by the controversial wooden figurines of Jews. 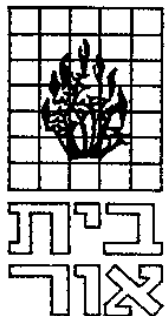
