## FROM THE CANTOR



“Shalom Aleichem Yiddin, ihr zint frei.” Those were six words uttered in a world that was hell, six words spoken that dared to offer a glimmer of hope to those whose hope had been incinerated. They were words – “Peace unto you, Jews, you are free” - uttered to remnants of the

Buchenwald concentration camp by Rabbi Herschel Schacter, the U.S. Army chaplain who entered the camp after it had been liberated by troops from General Patton’s Third Army. I read the story of Rabbi Schacter’s life and his efforts on behalf of the camp survivors in the obituaries published upon his passing this past March 21 at the age of 95.

His was a remarkable life. He was the first to be ordained by the illustrious Rabbi Joseph B. Soloveitchik; he served a congregation in the Bronx for over 50 years; he worked on behalf of Soviet Jewry; and he was a past chairman of the Conference of Presidents of Major American Jewish Organizations.

For all his accomplishments, I can imagine that many who read his obituary in the New York Times will remember him as the rabbi who reached out to pick up a little frightened boy hiding behind a mound of corpses, a boy named Lulek, who when asked how old he was responded, “What difference does it make. I’m older than you, anyway.”

“Why do you think you’re older?” asked Rabbi Schacter.

“Because you laugh and cry like a child,” Lulek replied. “I haven’t laughed in a long time, and I don’t even cry anymore. So which one of us is older?”

During President Obama’s recent trip to Israel, he met with Rabbi Israel Meir Lau, the former Ashkenazi Chief Rabbi and the current Chief Rabbi of Tel Aviv. The rabbi related this story to the President, for it was he, Rabbi Lau, who was that little seven-year-old Lulek.

We just celebrated the holiday of Pesach, and in the Haggadah we read the instruction that “in each generation one is obligated to regard himself as if he had come out of Egypt.” Are we not likewise

obligated to see ourselves as if we were there in Buchenwald, along with Lulek, along with Elie Wiesel, and along with all who experienced the inconceivable horrors, in Buchenwald and throughout the European continent? Only a small minority survived, most did not. It is incumbent upon us to keep the memories alive.

This year, as part of our Yom HaShoah commemoration, we at TBOBT will host on Sunday, April 7 at 2:00 pm a screening and discussion of a film describing how one family’s life was changed when the Nazis took over Vienna. The producer and speaker is Dan Bauer, nephew of our own Suzanne and Michael Miller. And on Monday, April 8 at 6:45 pm Kean University will host the community’s annual Yom HaShoah program featuring *Windows*, a play by Melissa Schaffer.

“Remembering is a noble and necessary act,” said Elie Wiesel in his Nobel Lecture in 1986. By attending these and other Holocaust commemorations we will help to keep the memories alive.

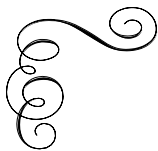

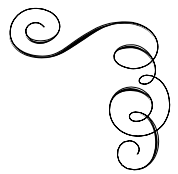

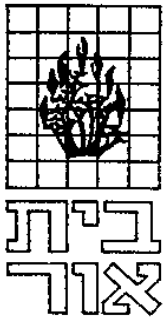
