The historical situation of Jews in the Diaspora created a people with multiple perspectives on their own situation.

Dr. Zeitlin manages to pack more than 50 stories, jokes and parables into a single lecture.

Dr. Steve Zeitlin is a folklorist, writer, and cultural activist. He is the founding director of **City Lore**, an organization that preserves New York City's living cultural heritage.

From the Cantor

It was a long time ago, but I remember the evening very well. It was cold outside, and it was Hanukkah, and I accompanied a friend as

we walked briskly toward our destination in Battery Park City, not far from the Hudson River in downtown Manhattan. We entered a large meeting room in one of the hotels, where a midweek prayer service was about to begin. The leaders took their positions. On one side stood a well-known teacher of Talmud from the local seminary, and on the other, a woman with a guitar began to strum and sing, with a voice that was warm and focused. This was a healing service, the first time I'd ever been to one, and the sweet singer was none other than Debbie Friedman.

There is not one among us who at some point in life does not need comfort and solace when the pain of loss takes hold. Debbie Friedman made it one of her life missions to help provide that comfort, and she did it through her music and through her presence, and she did it like no one else could. Her music found its way right into the heart, no doubt because it was written from the depths of the pain in her own heart, and her presence brought solace because she was always truly present, with compassion and understanding for others. She conveyed this unmistakably to her audiences, to the worshippers who came to pray with her. When people heard her Mi Shebeirach, their tears flowed because she was able to reach into that place of sorrow and massage away some of the pain, with music that was so moving, and words so penetrating.

Debbie Friedman's passing was a shock to us, for while it was known that she had suffered

from illness for many years, she was thought of as the caregiver and the comforter, the one to tend to the needs of others, and not one who would herself succumb. Now that she is gone, there is a void in the world of Jewish music and prayer. Comfort will continue to be found, surely, in the songs she left behind.

Mi Shebeirach avoteinu M'kor habracha l'imoteinu May the source of strength who blessed the ones before us, Help us find the courage to make our lives a blessing And let us say: Amen.
