FROM THE CANTOR

“**Without memory**, our existence would be barren and opaque....” So spoke Elie Wiesel when he received the Nobel Peace Prize in 1986. “If

anything can, it is memory that will save humanity.”

Indeed, there is no denying how important memory is, both the collective kind of which Wiesel spoke, as well as individual memory. Our future depends upon our remembering our history, our past -- as a people, and as part of human civilization. And of course, as individuals, especially as the years pass, we so rightly cherish our mind’s ability to recall -- names, places, and events.

As individuals, there are things the experts say we can do to protect our precious ability to recall. SHALOM JERUSALEM CALLING TBOBT

I can't believe how quickly time moves here. I've already been in Israel for 7 ½ months and living on Kibbutz Ein Tsurim for over 2 months, and I've truly loved every minute of it. Pesach is starting tomorrow, so we've been quite busy preparing and cleaning for the holiday. My roommate and I just finished pulling apart our entire room and cleaning EVERYTHING! I'm looking forward to exploring Israel over the next week, and spending time up north, which I haven't done much of so far this year. I even have plans to visit with the Weinshankers and their daughter and her family in Zichron Yaakov. We've done a lot in the past few weeks since I wrote my last article for the bulletin. Although most of my days are spent at work, spending time with my friends, and various creative projects (I've learned to crochet kippot!), Nativ always has us up and going. We spent Shabbat together and learned about topics such as the future of American Judaism and responsibility in Judaism. We spent Purim together in Jerusalem. Everyone dressed up for Nativ megillah reading motzei Shabbat in Ma'ale Hachamisha, which was followed by a Purim party, complete with karaoke! On Sunday we ventured to Holon, near Tel Aviv, for a Purim parade and lunch. We rounded out our weekend together in Jerusalem on Monday for Shushan Purim. The streets were lively and filled with music, and many people were still in costume. I find it so hard to believe that my time in Israel is almost up. I have about 7 days left of work in the refet, and a lot more to look forward to next month. It's just flown by. By the time you read this, I'll be winding down my time in Israel and getting ready to head home (I arrive at JFK on the morning of May 30th). This has truly been the experience of a lifetime!

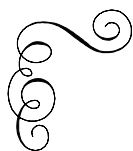

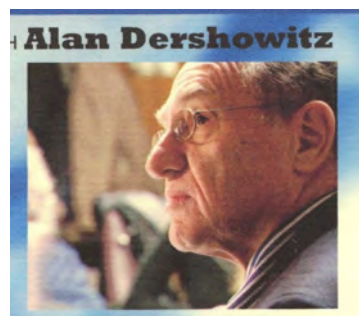

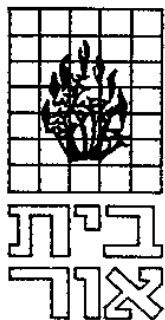
