FROM THE CANTOR



If someone were to ask you: Do you remember where you were and what you were doing exactly 10 years ago today, would you know? It is highly unlikely, unless you were asked that question on September 11, 2011. Then, there is a very good chance you would remember, just as many of us

who are old enough, remember where we were and what we were doing the day JFK was assassinated. Both events were traumas that left indelible imprints on our national and individual psyches.

There will be many events this year to commemorate the tenth anniversary of 9/11. The focus of attention will likely be on Ground Zero, where the two World Trade Center Towers were brought crashing to the ground in an act of evil terror. For many years, as a commuter between Brooklyn and Manhattan, I had walked beneath those Twin Towers; I would shop there, book browse, or sit down to relax with a cup of coffee in the early morning. It is still chilling for me to think that in a few brief moments, the places that had been a part of my daily life were reduced to rubble. Far more chilling is the thought of all the precious lives extinguished, in New York, Washington, and over Pennsylvania, and so many more lives, forever changed, by the loss of loved ones and friends. It was an episode of unspeakable horror.

But it was also one of great heroism. We must never forget, and always be grateful, to those who rushed into raging infernos to rescue their fellow citizens, and for the courageous sacrifice of those on board United Flight 93.

Historians will long study and debate the impact of 9/11 on our nation and on the world. It is too early for definitive judgments to be made. But what we know for sure is that the world is a different place today because of what happened on that morning in 2001. For now, as we approach the solemn tenth anniversary, let us take the time to remember those who died, and those who sacrificed so that others might live. And let us offer our prayers, that as we navigate this post 9/11 world, we may do so with renewed strength and confidence, in peace and in security, and always with the utmost appreciation for our nation, its people, and its values.

With the High Holidays upon us, I wish to take this opportunity to extend to you my heartfelt wishes for a Shana Tova u'Metukah. May this be a sweet New Year for you, your loved ones, and for the entire TBO/BT family. Bivracha,

I was also interviewed by phone by the Daily News, and at the game by Major League Baseball. Finally, the Yankees upgraded my seat for the game, and I sat behind the visitor's dugout. Overall, the treatment by the Yankees was spectacular, the day was surreal, and with a Yankee 6-4 win, pleasant beyond words.

We all have something we enjoy doing, and being a Yankee fan is one of mine. And with 27 World Series titles, it is good to know the object of one's attention are such WINNERS!


