

FROM THE CANTOR



Have you ever heard the story of the Yanov Torah? During World War II, the Jewish inmates of the Yanov labor camp in Poland secretly smuggled into the camp a Torah scroll from nearby Lvov. They did so by cutting it into sections that they wrapped around

their bodies to get them past the camp guards. They then hid the various fragments wherever they could—beneath the floorboards of the barracks, inside hollow bedposts, even burying them underground. For the secret prayer services they held in the camp, they would locate the appropriate section of Torah, and after reading from it they would return it to its hiding place.

After the camp was liberated in 1945, one survivor collected the scattered parchments and stitched them back into a single scroll. The Torah eventually made its way to the United States and found a home at the Hebrew Union College in Los Angeles. (We also have in our own sanctuary a Sefer Torah rescued from the ashes of the Holocaust.)

We cannot help but be moved by the story of the Yanov Torah. To risk death in a Nazi labor camp by praying with a parchment of Torah is a reflection of immeasurable love for the Torah and its teachings. As we carry the sacred scrolls this year on Simchat Torah, we might remember the Jews of Yanov, and find inspiration in their faith, loyalty, and courage. And let our celebration of Rejoicing with the Torah reflect our own pride, our gratitude, and our responsibility to our tradition and to our heritage.

During these closing days of the High Holidays, we pray for a *hatima tova*—that we may all be sealed in

the Book of Life for a year of good health, happiness and peace, for us and for our brothers and sisters in the Land of Israel, Amen.



FJMC National Convention - Casa Mesa, California July13-17, 2011

Michael W. Miller represented TBO/BT Men's Club at the National FJMC Convention. The Northern NJ Region had 18 attendees. The majority of the 400 plus attendees were from the USA and Canada. Clubs from India, Columbia, Chile and Mexico were represented. The theme of convention was "LEARNING, CAMARADERIE, ACTION." The underling focus was "Involving Men in Jewish life."

The convention speakers came from leading institution in North America, many from the Ziegler School of Rabbinic Studies at American Jewish University in Los Angeles. Daily Minyans (3 times) were led by Men's Club members. Three types of morning Minyans were held: learners, traditional, and meditation by the pool. Attending a Minyan with over 100 people singing and not racing against a clock was inspirational. Shabbat services were lead by Hazzan Alberto Mizrahi (Chicago) with assistance from Hazzan Joanna Dulkin and Hazzan Judy Sofer. Friday night service was accompanied by a 5 piece band. Saturday, there was a learners and traditional service. Over 400 people were at services. A huge Havdalah service was lead by Al Davis outside on the hotel patio.


