FROM THE CANTOR



I've read that after interviewing the President of the United States for the Atlantic Monthly, journalist Jeffrey Goldberg handed him a copy of the newly published "New American Haggadah," for which he had written some of the commentary. President Obama, who holds an annual Seder at the White House,

thumbed through the pages and then asked: "Does this mean we can't use the Maxwell House Haggadah anymore?"

Regardless of your political preferences in this highly-charged 2012 election cycle, you can still appreciate in the president's comment a reflection, as Goldberg has written, of the great veneration American Jews have had for this Haggadah first published 1932. More than 50 million copies later, it does continue to be the gold standard and a favorite at many a Seder. After all, you can't beat the price. It was originally offered to anyone who bought a can of Maxwell House coffee, but now you can simply pick it up at many supermarkets. It's reassuring to know that if your old copies, like mine, tend to become excessively wine and horseradish-stained, it's easy to obtain replacements.

But these days you have a choice, because Maxwell House is no longer the only free Haggadah in town. There is a competing version at the ShopRite supermarket published by a Michigan company that features Gold's products on the cover. So this year I had to decide whether upon sitting down to retell the story of the Exodus I wanted to be reminded of my morning cup of coffee or my evening bowl of borsht. Of course with Golds's I could also contemplate some schav, which was a favorite growing up in my home. There is also depicted on the cover a full selection of horseradish, which was also a favorite, although we called it chrain, and it was homemade with my father grinding the root by hand in the pre-foodprocesser era. I will tell you that I settled upon the Gold's Haggadah, perhaps because of design considerations, but also, I think, because there on the cover was included a jar of Hungarian Cabbage Soup, which in my mother's sweet and sour version, was out of this world.

But on the subject of food, it's really quinoa that has taken up most of my attention in recent days. Having received a call questioning whether it was kosher for Pesach, I researched the matter and found it to be a little more complex than I had hoped. It depends on whether quinoa is considered to be in the category of *kitniyot*, and whether the plant is grown or processed together with grains such as wheat and barley, as well as a number of other important considerations. The answer I offered to the questioner was necessarily a nuanced one reflecting the various opinions and approaches to the subject.

But the point I really want to make is that I'm always impressed by how seriously folks take the matter of Passover kashrut, Even those who are not otherwise very careful about kashrut and Jewish ritual will, when it comes to Pesach, exercise a little more care. I have seen over the years fellow Jews walk into a coffee shop in Manhattan and insist that their BLT be served on matzah!

This faithfulness to Pesach traditions is gratifying and owed perhaps to our memories of parents going to great lengths to prepare for and observe the holiday. Or there may be something intrinsic to this holiday--which celebrates our freedom from bondage, which would have us return to the basics of life, like the flour and water of unleavened bread, which brings family and friends together for a joyous and meaningful experience--that causes us to embrace Pesach and its ancient rituals with such loyalty.

I am glad this is so. And regardless of the Haggadah you choose to read from this year, I extend to you and your families my best wishes for a kosher and zissen Pesach!

One doesn't need to look very far to find someone who is homeless, someone who lacks adequate medical care, someone who seeks employment to support a family. This is not the Promised Land for thousands upon thousands for whom it should be just that.

Many are enslaved not by physical bonds, or even economic bonds, but by bonds of memory and emotion. Slavery comes in many forms, and to these forms of enslavement, the message of Passover speaks loudly, as well. Redemption is the promise for all people.
